Caleb. From climbing to the peaks of mountains to hear heartfelt moments shared, to challenging some youth in river rescues in glacier streams in the rocky mountains, to impromptu mud slides on the banks of the Red Deer River. While we can do all these incredible camps, they would amount to nothing without sharing the story and the love of Jesus Christ. This year I have felt blessed by God, to be able to witness His spirit at work.

Starting off into the stories, I was blessed to hear a small exchange between two siblings who shared a moment of mourning and placed a stone to memorialize their thankfulness for their mother. I love that I get to guide young people to these places and for them to have these graspable moments of healing with God. I know in those moments all the struggle, and pain make a little more sense. A few days later we trained the youth on how to paddle canoes down the

river. This year had far more water flowing through than I am familiar with. There were whirlpools in places I don't remember them having whirlpools. These caught leaders' canoes off guard and tipped them which resulted in a leader without his glasses and a runaway boat floating down the river. During this ordeal a youth and myself were right in tow doing our very best in the rushing water to pull it to shore. We struggled with all our might to pull it



into an eddy then getting it to a safe area to load back up into. This was a challenging feat with a young man who pushed himself to beat every challenge that came before him the

entire time he was with us. I can very easily and honestly say that I am proud of him and his determination. And I pray that he would know through this experience that Jesus is there for him and that he has a God who wants to be there to help him through every challenge the world has before him. I pray he

would know God's love as He is the best Father there is.

Now I know it sounds like everything we do is challenging, but I do enjoy every minute of our trips. It's a blast and though the wilderness is a harsh and difficult place, it offers wonderful opportunities and memories. We had to endure pouring rain nearly all day

on the Red Deer River on this particular trip. While we were paddling down, we stopped on shore and created the banks to turn into the best muddy slip and slide. Suddenly all the complaining of being wet and cold was immediately forgotten. The kids were all mud and smiles shooting down the banks that day. All of these trips and memories allow us to display and make known the loving God that made it all...Who in the midst of this awesome creation has seen us as human beings as His masterpiece. When He was done with creating us, He not only said it was very good, but He then willingly gave Himself up for us to make right what we couldn't. So that we may be with Him and not apart.

Ministry hasn't been on my radar this last while with Isaac being gone most of the summer, trying to figure out where and how to move, and then finally settling into our new home when we did figure things out. I look forward to the fenced yard, and the open basement for young moms, and young adults to come visit our home and do Bible study. I had one young mom and her family visit and she quite often is at home on reserve with no car to go anywhere most of the time. She stays with her two littles that are just toddlers. I will hopefully be helping her reconnect with the church, (as she was a former youth that came to girls' group and life360) and help her in different ways to succeed in getting her high school diploma, housing, and other paperwork that can help her be more independent.
