Dear Friend,

As we approach the ninth anniversary of **Sacred Path Fellowship**, the Native-friendly urban church I'm serving, along with two other elders, I'm glad to report that God has blessed this work in many ways, from the very beginning. I'm very grateful for that.

SPF has a widespread unifying influence among First Nations churches and believers in the Pacific Northwest. The four **Tribal Ministry Conferences** we helped organize and host, brought Native leaders and their people together, from across the spectrum of theological and worship traditions. Conference attendees have rated the value of these events very highly.

This same kind of diversity is reflected in our local fellowship, but we maintain unity through our commitment to honoring Christ and biblical authority, and through love and respect for one another. We have five men in our **Sacred Path Fellowship** teaching/preaching rotation. We are going through the book of Acts at this time.

NAIM staff and the ministries they represent are fully funded through and solely accountable to North America Indigenous Ministries.

Every week, following worship and teaching, we open our meetings for people to respond to the message, or to report on what's happening in their lives. This is followed by corporate prayers, followed by a potluck meal. Folks really value and enjoy the freedom to participate in our meetings and to visit over food.

Please join me in praying for greater effectiveness in reaching unchurched and non-believing Native families and individuals in the greater Tacoma area. Also, please pray for younger ministry leaders to join us in the development of Sacred Path Fellowship. And for Creator's guidance in a possible re-launch of ministry to the Suquamish Tribe.

Family News: In early October, Nancy was the victim of a smash-and-grab robbery. As she pulled into a store parking lot, a thief smashed out her passenger side window, grabbed her purse, and ran. It turns out the police knew who they were looking for, but it took about three months for him to be caught. He had victimized about 27 women in the same way. At his arrest, he was armed and he rammed police vehicles with a stolen car. He's scheduled for trial in March, facing 35 felonies.

Nancy was not hurt, and her phone was found by some kids in a park near the crime. And somehow, their parents found a way to contact us even though we had disabled her phone. Scary, but it could have been much worse. Thank God!! (We are praying for his salvation in prison.)

Thank you for your support of this ministry through your prayers and gifts. We are blessed.
