Our four **Tribal Ministry Conferences** have been greatly appreciated by most all attendees. However, efforts to recruit additional help in the planning process have not been successful. Therefore, we believe God is directing us take a break for at least a year. There will be quite a few disappointed people, but this seems to be a wise decision.

Our conference planning team members are also the ones who have been discussing the idea of bringing the **Carry The Cure** youth outreach team to Western Washington. Additionally, a number of reservation pastors have indicated interest in this, but so far the needed leadership for this major effort has not materialized. So again, it does not look like the timing is right for this.
