Thankfully, two parents of some of the teens stepped up and took on the challenge of leading the team. Their willingness brought fresh energy, but it also meant a few scheduling adjustments—which, in turn, created some confusion with our use of the hall in Klemtu. When we finally arrived, we

discovered that the hall we normally rely on for most of our ministries was already occupied. Ugh! Where would we meet now? Prayers went up quickly as we searched for a solution.

Community members stepped in. Not only did they secure use of the school gym for our team, they also upgraded the team's housing to a better option. Thank you, Lord.

So, the children's ministries happened as planned but in the new location. Youth ministries never really got off the ground until the final night.

In the end, I believe it happened the way God wanted. The community received the team warmly. They want the Church to return next year and already began planning on how it can be done in an even better way. Community buy-in is so important to what we do. The Lord graciously provided for that as well.

I've left out plenty of other details and challenges along the way. But the new team did get their feet wet in Klemtu ministry, gaining valuable experience. And every one of the teens is eager to return, which is always a good sign. And most importantly, the Gospel was shared and relationships established.
