Contemplating the Quotidian

Recently, I've been unpacking boxes, organizing closet space and washing dishes. All to settle in with friends so I can delve into job-hunting in Tacoma, WA. It's made me think of Brother Lawrence and how he pondered spiritual truths

in a monastery ... while peeling potatoes over a kitchen sink. This 17th century friar, like us, needed reminders of how the "set-apart-ness" of God is mixed up in everyday life.

"We have been set apart as holy because Yeshua Christ did what God wanted [H]im to do by sacrificing [H]is body once and for all."

—Hebrews 10:10 NOG

Over thirty years ago, Kathleen Norris penned *The Quotidian Mysteries:* Laundry, Liturgy & "Women's Work". In it, she writes: "It is a quotidian mystery that dailiness can lead to such despair and yet also be at the core

of our salvation. We express this every time we utter the Lord's Prayer." *Quotidian* is defined as "of or occuring every day ... especially when mundane". Think: *routine*, *ordinary* or *commonplace*.





Each (Extra)ordinary Day

Routine can lend to thinking of life as *less* important: *Brush my teeth, comb my hair, shower. (Yawn.) Repeat.* But, can't the ordinary also draw us *into* the Holy? *God's mercies are new every morning. The hairs on my head are numbered by my Creator! I'm fearfully and wonderfully made.* Whatever our personal struggles, we can cast our cares upon God today. Are we dealing with a long-term problem or a short-term pain? Talk to our God now ... Who is **for** us, **not against** us!

"Bless the Lord! The God of our salvation supports us day after day! Selah" —Psalm 68:19 *CEB*

In the wilderness, God told the Israelites to gather manna *each day*—except on the Sabbath, when the Lord provided twice as much the day before. (Those who tried to

glean on the Sabbath found rotten provision that morning.) After God's temple was established, the Israelites were tasked with *daily* sacrifices to God—part of "the holy gifts and offerings for sin that make peace with God for Israel" (Neh 10:33). In Matthew's gospel, he recalls Jesus teaching the disciples to pray: "Abba in Heaven, ... give us *each day* that day's bread—no more, no less—and forgive us what we owe to You ..." (Matt 6:9-12).

Navigating Uncertainty

Whether visiting the grocery store or library, the post office or petrol station, I need a map to navigate the unfamiliar streets! Still, I've made it regularly to Sacred Path Fellowship (SPF), a NAIM ministry in Tacoma. This band of many Native believers gathers Saturday mornings to worship and share a potluck meal. And though the rainy weather causes me to pause, I made it to an early Thanksgiving meal with 100+ others at New Hope Nazarene church in Lakewood (a southern suburb)! Now I know Jeannie and Rico and Paula. And I was part of the cleanup team!
