Mount Currie Ministry Moments

We had a great summer camp this year at Red Soul Rising. The emphasis was on the biblical story, leading up to Jesus. It began with a memorable teaching on how the scriptures came to be, and ended with reminders that God's word is our hope and strength. The leadership team from Crystal Lake evangelical free church did a fantastic job! 48 youth attended camp. Some of the older teen girls chose to be baptized before camp was over. This is new

and encouraging, as it may be the first time this has happened at RSR. The kids often stay in touch with their counsellors throughout the year.

Every child left with a Bible of their own, as well as stickers with QR code links to a Bible app, the Jesus film, and the Bible project video descriptors.



A first Nations brother and I have worked to begin facilitating a Bible study. The M28 global app is the structure, and is almost identical to the discipleship plan I had hoped would be received when we moved here. Everyone gets a turn to facilitate the weekly discussion, which is around a section of scripture. The format is not knowledge based so much as living out the personal practical implications discovered in the text, while connecting with others. A few older alumni from camp are the ones who are interested at this time. The phrase “never despise small beginnings” is actually inspired by Zechariah 4:10 **“Do not despise these small beginnings, for the Lord rejoices to see the work begin.”**



Bull riding is the adrenaline sport of choice here. I was invited by a youth mentor and bull riding instructor (Ha7ya) to begin the instruction with a prayer. The older teen boys from camp and their friends were the ones who make up most of the group. These guys also really enjoyed the archery that Temera taught at camp, and there was talk of making up our own team.

Sometimes I don't realize what impact is had on others. I spent a little time with a known drug dealer awhile back, but I was recently surprised and encouraged by the endearing way he described me as a “brother from another mother.” On another occasion an acquaintance had some words to Jesus that seemed inspired by evil. But I still offered a ride to him the next time, and was surprised by his cheery confession that his daughter was in his life now, and that it was an answer to prayers we had prayed together, that I had all but forgotten about from some time before!

Temera taught archery every day at camp again this year, and by the end, each tent division had received a turn. Her step dad is currently in hospital, and just had a number of heart attacks. He underwent surgery, and each day is vital if he is to recover. Please join us in prayer for him.
